Area animal issues will be dealt with on an individual basis by calling the office and submitting a complaint.

Save-A-Pet is inspected and has a kennel permit. Strays are drop-offs by people who no longer want their dogs. When you see a stray animal, call the Animal Control office.

Open Discussion:

Block/Street Party was briefly discussed and approved. We will plan the party at the next meeting and set a date in February for the event.

Pat Carney brought up the Emergency Communications Team ECT and the Family Radio Service FRS. Radios are available for \$11 each and have a 5-7 mile range.

Certified Emergency Response Team CERT training is being planned for early next year. Pat said we can schedule a course as soon as there are enough people. There are about 5 people who want to attend as of today's date. The CERT covers CPR, First Aid, Triage, Fire Fighting, Search and Rescue. The time commitment is one Thursday night and two Saturdays.

The next County Service Area CSA meeting is scheduled for November 8, 2008 at the VFW 9 a.m. It's the Road and Lighting commission.

There's loud music on Long Canyon after 10 p.m. and throughout the day. People are calling the Sheriff's Dept without any resolution. We advised each other to call and complain and if there's no resolution, the B-BAR-H Community Association will formally address the issue.
